

Deferred Disposition

Deferred Disposition is a suspended sentence. On your **plea of guilty or no contest**, the court will defer a finding of guilt, assess court costs and order that you pay a Special Expense Fee. You will be ordered to comply with certain conditions.

If you successfully comply with **all** the Terms & Conditions, your conviction will be dismissed.

If you fail to comply with any of the Terms or conditions, you will receive a FINAL OPPORTUNITY to appear before the Judge to explain why you did not comply with Court Orders. If you do not appear a judgement will be imposed, and a conviction will be reported to the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS).

How do I request Deferred Disposition?

You may request Deferred Disposition online or via email courtclerk@pineypt.org. This must be requested, on or before your first appearance (date on the citation document issued by the officer).

90 Days- Moving Violations-maintain no new moving violations during 90 day period.

180 Days- Failure to Maintain Financial Responsibility-maintain ACTIVER AUTO INSURANCE WITH YOU AS A LISTED DRIVER and no new moving violations for 180 days.

The Deferred Disposition form will be emailed to you by the court. The form will list the terms and conditions specific to you and your case.

If the offense is a traffic offense classified as a moving violation and the defendant is 25 years of age or younger, the judge requires the defendant complete a Driver Safety Course as a condition of deferred disposition.

Items Required

- Pay online or in-person , this is equivalent to the fine amount.
- Copy of your Texas Driver's License and Auto Liability Insurance Card or other proof of Financial Responsibility listing the defendant as a covered driver (emailed or UPLOAD online)
